2-DAY: EVENT BASED ITINERARY

FRIDAY

International Camel Races (Sept.) - Virginia City

Who would have thought that camels could race? But that's just what they do when they're not spitting at their opponents every September in Virginia City. Camels were used by the U.S. Army to pack wood, salt and freight in the 1860s, which helped lead to this one-of-a-kind activity. Hundreds gather for this hilarious event.

Virginia City - Tours

Once a vital settlement between Denver and San Francisco, Virginia City influenced the entire country. During its boom, Virginia City's mining proceeds amounted to millions of dollars, equaling billions today. Every inch of this picturesque, Victorian-era town celebrates its colorful history. Stroll authentic wooden sidewalks to Old West saloons, shops, museums and restaurants or visit historic churches, 19th century homes, public buildings and quaint cemeteries. Venture out on a ride on a stagecoach, horsedrawn carriage, trolley or the V&T Railroad steam engine train that crosses the high desert landscape dotted with old mines. The Great Reno Balloon Race (Sept.) - Reno Glow Show -

Beginning at 5 a.m. on Saturday and Sunday, glowing balloons will act as a beacon to those sleepy spectators making their way to the launch field. Each year different balloons participate in this fun show to make way for the highly anticipated Dawn Patrol. Don't miss this year's participants!

Dawn Patrol - A trademark of The Great Reno Balloon Race and worthy of the early rise, Dawn Patrol features a handful of balloons that are qualified to fly in the dark. This is a dangerous task as atmospheric conditions change drastically as the sun begins to rise. Balloonists glow, twinkle and fly along with choreographed music across a darkened sky, leaving the crowd awestruck. Saturday and Sunday only. **renoballoon.com**

DAY 1

Bus to Carson City

Nevada State Railroad Museum

The Nevada State Railroad Museum, in Carson City, preserves the railroad heritage of Nevada, including locomotives and cars of the famous Virginia and Truckee Railroad. Much of the museum equipment was obtained from Hollywood studios, where they were often featured in movies and television. Museum activities consist of operation of historic railroad equipment, including train rides, handcar rides, lectures, an annual railroad history symposium, changing exhibits and a variety of special events.

Train Ride to Virginia City

Virginia & Truckee Railroad Ride & Tour - Nevada's most famous short line is the Virginia & Truckee Railroad that connected Reno with Carson City, Virginia City and Minden. Operating for 80 years, the V&T was Nevada's Bonanza railroad as it hauled valuable Comstock ore to quartz reduction mills located at Silver City and along the Carson River. The V&T Railroad recently underwent a \$30 million expansion and offers daily trips. Visitors can board the historic railway in Carson City and arrive in Virginia City just like "back in the day." virginiatruckee.com, 775-847-0380

DAY 2

Tour of the National Automobile Museum - Reno

The National Automobile Museum (The Harrah Collection), in downtown Reno, displays over 220 antique, vintage and classic cars, many of which came from gaming magnate William F. Harrah's famous collection. The collection's stars include the 1907 Thomas Flyer, winner of the 1908 New York to Paris race, and several cars owned by Hollywood stars. Wild Horses

Tour of Lake Tahoe

DAY 1

Bird Tour Company: Birding Under Nevada Skies

Day Trip to Fallon

Spring Wings Bird Festival (May)

Professionals from the Lahontan Audubon Society, U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service and Nevada Department of Wildlife will lead birding and wildlife tours in the Lahontan Valley Wetlands. **springwings.org**

Stillwater National Wildlife Refuge

The Carson Lake Wetlands and nearby Stillwater National Wildlife Refuge are key respites to migratory birds along









the Pacific Flyway. Shorebirds are common in the wetlands, approximately 70 miles east of Reno, and waterfowl arrive by the hundreds of thousands in the late fall.

DAY 3

Easy Tour in Reno

Reno has several urban parks and wildlife areas that are easily accessible to visitors. The Oxbow Nature Study Area runs parallel to the Truckee River just a few miles upstream of downtown Reno. It's the first park of its kind in Nevada and is quickly being duplicated in other areas of the state. The lush banks, thick cottonwoods and willows and quiet paths create an Eden just a short hike from the hustle and bustle of downtown. Two miles of trails meander through the area and interpretive signs explain the flora and fauna to be found along the river. Parts of the park are wheelchair accessible, and wooden benches along the way make it a perfect destination for a leisurely stroll.
